ACCA is committed to meeting families where they are, and our staff works hard to support families and our community each day. Another year of providing services to families through our Developmental Disabilities Resource Connections Program (DDRC), FASD Diagnostic Team, Family Wellness Program (FWP), Infant Learning Program (ILP) and Loan Closet has allowed ACCA to engage with families across 280,000 square miles of Alaska.

Additionally, ACCA was awarded a four-year grant to support work in engagement with families who may have reluctance to participate in Infant Learning Program services or have stressors that may impact their ability to engage in services. We appreciate the support the State Infant Learning Program received from the Alaska Mental Health Trust to make this grant possible. The advantages of supporting families at their pace have already shown to have a positive impact on rates of engagement.

I am extremely proud of our staff and how they rise to every occasion and strive to not only support the families we serve, but also support their co-workers and other community providers. Our team is passionate about their work, but also about how they build relationships with each other and our partners. It takes an incredible team to provide the support to meet families where they are and ACCA staff have risen to meet that need.

Each of our programs have seen an increase in requested services this past year which required our staff to make creative adjustments to how we meet the increased referrals and need for services. Every member of our team plays a vital role in our agency and for each of our families. When everyone steps up, the communities we serve benefit from our commitment, and we have watched our relationships flourish and grow during this post pandemic period.


